Advocacy in Action

Have your voice heard. A big part of the work of the CAND is to advocate on behalf of the profession at the federal level. Here's what we have been working on:

Government Relations

Our advocacy team has been actively engaging with newly appointed ministries to understand how their priorities align with the future of naturopathic medicine. We're currently working on scheduling Hill visits for November to keep the conversation going, and we're excited to launch our first official Hill Day in May.

We remain focused on expanding naturopathic benefits for veterans. An extensive survey will be released next month to gather evidence in support of this initiative—please check your email and the ND Portal next month. We're also in contact with the Assembly of First Nations and the First Nations Health Authority to continue advancing naturopathic medicine benefits for Indigenous Peoples.

Regulation Updates

Advancing regulation continues to be a key priority. The CAND is supporting associations across Canada in their efforts to become regulated by providing grants, research support, position papers, and advocacy guidance. We recognize that regulation is essential for expanding scope of practice, increasing public access, and enhancing understanding of naturopathic medicine.

Over the summer, the CAND met with several regulators to discuss shared interests, including labour mobility. This September marks the launch of a national gathering of leaders in naturopathic medicine, formerly known as the CNCC, where association leaders, regulators, and educators will come together to share knowledge and insights.

Moving the Dial on Advocacy

The CAND has been working to develop the framework for some new and exciting Committees. We want to expand the opportunity for member voices to be heard and ideas to be generated.

Naturopathic Legacy Project



Drs. Boucher and Farnsworth - Part 2

Dr. Gerald Farnsworth was instrumental in the founding and survival of several important naturopathic organizations. As one of the founders of the National College of Naturopathic Medicine in Portland, Oregon, he held key positions on that Board from 1956 to 1979, as well as teaching and administrative positions. As a founding member of the Canadian Naturopathic Foundation, he served as its mainstay and visionary until his retirement. In 1957, he was also a founder of the Northwest Naturopathic Physicians Convention, the longest-running annual naturopathic convention in the world. He received numerous awards for outstanding practice and professional achievements.

Other naturopathic doctors matched his dedication to the profession in BC as they envisioned a Western Canadian naturopathic school. Cidalia Paiva, PhD, was one of the early champions and guided the formation of the West Coast Naturopathic Medical College in 1999, welcoming its first class in January 2000. A financial crisis was averted largely by the extraordinary contributions of students, faculty, and the profession. After gaining CNME accreditation, the college was renamed the Boucher Institute of Naturopathic Medicine in 2001, in honour of Dr. Joseph Boucher, another outstanding naturopathic doctor who embraced the Principles of Naturopathic Medicine to their fullest.




